News from Mr. K...

This is our last newsletter of this academic year and also the last one being sent from Hillside! With that said, it's fitting that our last topic is the new Sunita Williams Elementary School. We are on schedule to open this September and, though construction is over 90% complete, the summer months will be very busy with the delivery of new furniture, new equipment and the curriculum resources and materials the staff are presently packing to be sent over. There are also a number of required and essential inspections, which need to be successfully completed before we can occupy our new wonderful space. Many

parents and some students have asked if we will be able to have an open house for families before September and, because we cannot determine the possibility of that happening at this time, I have included two links which I shared at this past Wednesday's meeting for you to access for an update on the building. The first is the latest <u>bird's-eye-view</u> of the building and campus, taken by Needham photographer and resident, Yehuda Inbar. The second is a <u>virtual tour</u> of the school filmed earlier this week. Please pardon the inconsistencies in sound and inexperienced realtor guiding you through the building!

At that meeting we also started a conversation about some of the logistics that need to be worked out about how to ensure that safe drop-off and pick-up procedures are in place and to plan safe walking or biking routes. If you are interested in being a part of the safe routes conversation, please contact Hillside (soon to be Sunita Williams!) parent, Libby Moore at libbyzugmoore@yahoo.com for information on how you might be able to help your children and neighborhood friends walk or bike to school via the safest route. Necessary work is being done on the roads and sidewalks around the new campus and should be completed soon. School staff and I will continue to meet with the Needham Police and town officials to address these procedures and routes over the coming weeks, and I will update you in August on our progress.
