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## A Message From Mrs. Greiff:

### Spring Allergies

I have seen many students for spring allergy symptoms this week. Sometimes we are doing everything right and still the pollen prevails. Or, sometimes, children refuse to do what's best for them and ignore our advice! Please check with your pediatrician before giving any medications.



Seasonal allergy symptoms are hard to reverse once they start, so the best action is prevention. The over-the-counter, non-sedating medications work well when taken daily. The same is true for antihistamine eye drops. Please consider giving them in the morning before school.

### Other Preventive Measures:

Wear hats and sunglasses for recess

Wash hands and face when coming indoors

Keep car and house windows closed

Shower before bed

Wash bed sheets more frequently

Use saline nasal sprays as needed to rinse nasal passages

spend reading, or are read aloud to, using a paper or online reading log. Children receive a free book and a voucher for a WNBA summer basket ball game when they sign up. They receive a small toy prize for every 4 hours of reading, up to 16 hours. Children who complete the program by reading or being read to for 16 hours by August 5th will receive a second free book and a ticket to the August 5th Pawtucket Pawsox baseball game. 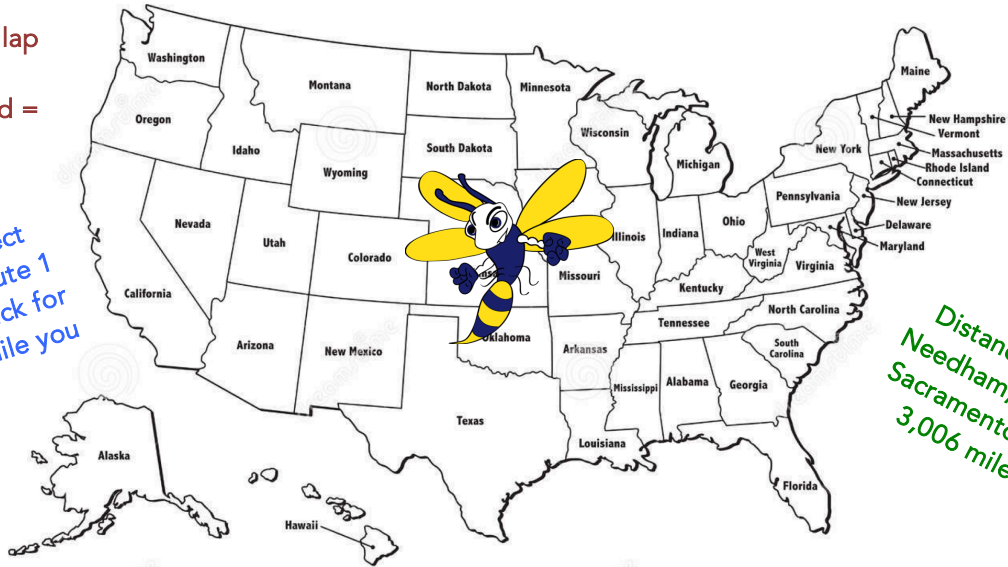
