Our key message to your children will be to listen carefully to their teacher during the drill. The teacher may tell the class to stay in place or to leave the building quickly. We do not want to raise the anxiety level of our students or families. Instead, we want folks to think of this as they do fire drills, just good preparation for all of us. As was the case last year, the Needham Police will be present when the drill is held.


