Dear Families,

Happy New Year! I thought I would provide you with some information regarding influenza (the flu), as we are in "flu season", and according to the Centers for Disease and Prevention (CDC), influenza activity has increased. Flu season peaks between December and February but the flu can occur between October and May.

Influenza is a respiratory viral illness that is contagious and can be spread from up to 6 feet away. Influenza is spread through "droplets" which occur when infected people cough, sneeze or talk.

Prevention-As influenza is contagious, it is important to take the following measures to prevent the spread of the flu:

- Get vaccinated annually with the injectable flu vaccine
- Avoid close contact with people who are ill
- Stay home until you are fever free for 24 hours off of all fever reducing medications
- Cover your nose/mouth with a tissue when coughing/sneezing
- Don't touch your nose/mouth/eyes
- Proper handwashing (washing with warm, soapy water for at least 20 seconds)
- · Use a disinfectant cleaner to wipe down common items such as doorknobs, computers, phones, etc.

Symptoms of flu include: fever/chills, cough, sore throat, runny nose or nasal congestion, muscle or body aches, headaches, and fatigue.

Treatment includes: rest, hydration, analgesics/fever reducing medication such as Acetaminophen and/or Ibuprofen, and antiviral medications (as prescribed by your healthcare provider.) If you have symptoms of the flu, check with your healthcare provider promptly. Antiviral medications may be an option and when taken within 48 hours of symptoms, these medications may lessen the duration and severity of the flu. In addition, antivirals that are taken after 48 hours may still be effective.

Colds versus Flu: How to Tell the Difference

Are you coming down with a cold? Do you have the flu? The table below shows some differences and similarities between colds and flu.

Differences Between Colds and the Flu		
WITH A COLD:	WITH THE FLU:	
Symptoms are usually less severe than flu symptoms	Symptoms are usually more severe than cold symptoms	
Symptoms develop gradually over a few days.	Symptoms come on quickly and severely.	
You rarely have a fever.	You almost always have a fever .	
You feel sick mostly in your head and nose.	Your entire body feels sick.	
Body aches, headaches and pain are usually mild if you have them.	Body aches, headaches and pain are common and can be severe.	
You may or may not feel tired and weak.	Tiredness and weakness are common.	
There is no vaccine to protect you.	You can get vaccine (a shot or the nasal spray) to protect yourself.	
There are no prescription medicines to treat colds.	There are prescription medicines to treat the flu.


