#### Letter from Dan Gutekanst, Superintendent of Schools:

Dear Needham Public Schools Families:

I need your help!

One of the key activities outlined in the 2017-18 Needham Public Schools Goals is to "develop a strategic plan for technology." The intent of this key activity is for the district to have agreements in place about its vision and accompanying actionable recommendations that further technology-enabled teaching, learning, and organizational productivity. It is this strategic plan that will guide the district's future programmatic, operational, and financial decisions regarding technology.

A broad-based team whose members reflect the insights/ thinking of various grade levels and program areas across the district is currently engaged in the work of developing this plan. The charge for the group is to draft a long-range plan for technology in the Needham Public Schools with clear goals and milestones that are aligned with the national strategy outlined in the Future Ready Learning (U.S. Department of Education).

As part of this process, we need to ensure that our work is informed by and reflects the thoughts, attitudes, and opinions of all the constituencies within the Needham school community and beyond. To this end, the strategic planning team is asking for about 10 minutes of your time **before January 26, 2018,** to provide us with your perspective on various aspects of current use and future directions for technology within the district.

#### NEF Large Grant Applications Due January 23rd

Do you have an innovative and collaborative idea that has the potential to make a broad and lasting impact on Needham public school students? The Needham Education Foundation (NEF) is now accepting Large Grant applications for funding up to \$15,000. They can support one- or two-year programs and can benefit the entire school system, multiple schools, an entire school, or a distinct population within the system. Past awards include Google Virtual Reality Expeditions Kits at High Rock, a portable planetarium for the Science Center, and funding for interdisciplinary learning pilot programs. For two-year grants, applicants must re-apply to explain the need for a second year of funding (up to \$15,000 for the second year, but approval is not guaranteed). Dear Families,

Happy New Year! I thought I would provide you with some information regarding influenza (the flu), as we are in "flu season", and according to the Centers for Disease and Prevention (CDC), influenza activity has increased. Flu season peaks between December and February but the flu can occur between October and May.

Influenza is a respiratory viral illness that is contagious and can be spread from up to 6 feet away. Influenza is spread through "droplets" which occur when infected people cough, sneeze or talk.

Prevention-As influenza is contagious, it is important to take the following measures to prevent the spread of the flu:

- Get vaccinated annually with the injectable flu vaccine
- Avoid close contact with people who are ill
- Stay home until you are fever free for 24 hours off of all fever reducing medications
- Cover your nose/mouth with a tissue when coughing/sneezing
- Don't touch your nose/mouth/eyes
- Proper handwashing (washing with warm, soapy water for at least 20 seconds)
- Use a disinfectant cleaner to wipe down common items such as doorknobs, computers, phones, etc.

Symptoms of flu include: fever/chills, cough, sore throat, runny nose or nasal congestion, muscle or body aches, headaches, and fatigue.

Treatment includes: rest, hydration, analgesics/fever reducing medication such as Acetaminophen and/or Ibuprofen, and antiviral medications (as prescribed by your healthcare provider.) If you have symptoms of the flu, check with your healthcare provider promptly. Antiviral medications may be an option and when taken within 48 hours of symptoms, these medications may lessen the duration and severity of the flu. In addition, antivirals that are taken after 48 hours may still be effective.

## Colds versus Flu: How to Tell the Difference

Are you coming down with a cold? Do you have the flu? The table below shows some differences and similarities between colds and flu.

Differences Between Colds and the Flu		
WITH A COLD:	WITH THE FLU:	
Symptoms are usually <b>less severe</b> than flu symptoms	Symptoms are usually <b>more severe</b> than cold symptoms	
Symptoms develop <b>gradually</b> over a few days.	Symptoms come on <b>quickly</b> and severely.	
You rarely have a fever.	You almost always have a <b>fever</b> .	
You feel sick mostly in your head and nose.	Your <b>entire body</b> feels sick.	
Body aches, headaches and pain are usually mild if you have them.	Body aches, headaches and pain are common and can be severe.	
You may or may not feel tired and weak.	Tiredness and weakness are common.	
There is no vaccine to protect you.	You can get vaccine (a shot or the nasal spray) to protect yourself.	
There are no prescription medicines to treat colds.	There are prescription medicines to treat the flu.














# Hornets Buzz Across America




This year, the Hillside Hornets are going to work together to buzz our way across America!!! We will watch the Hillside Hornet travel across the map that's in the Hillside lobby.
