For over 25 years, the Needham Education Foundation (NEF) has funded these and many other entertaining and educational programs that "make learning come alive" for Needham public school students. If you have an innovative idea to enhance your child's learning experience or school community, we want to hear from you!

The NEF is now accepting applications. Small grant applications for up to \$5,000 (\$3,000 per school for multi-school grants) are due March 20th.

The NEF continues to offer two additional options to ease the small grant application process: (1) Express Grants allow applicants to apply for a program already funded by NEF at another school; (2) Multi-School Grants allow schools to apply together without the constraints of the small grant funding limit.




